AMET, the very first Maritime University in India has also got the distinction of very first maritime educational institution gone for assessment and accreditation with National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) and obtained the grade as 'GOOD'.operation, which made us possible to attain these achievements.

Likewise, accreditation given to the post-sea courses offered at AMET is also a worthy mention here. International Conference on Shipping : Indispensable to the World (IMO Theme for 2016)

Dr G Thiruvassagam, Vice Chancellor of AMET University has welcomed the dignitaries and delegates. In his welcome note he emphasized the historical significance of maritime culture in india especially in Tamil Nadu. He recalled the maritime accomplishments of ancient Chola Kings in general and King Rajendara Chola in particular further more. Vice Chancellor emphasized the immense importance of shipping to the current world needs.





NAESEY Dr J Ramachandran, Founder President of AMET University delivered the presidential address in which he narrated the historical milestones of AMET University in its two decades committed contribution to the shipping industry. He stated that the purpose of shipping is to cater the diverse need of human society. The very existence of human society in such an advanced stage itself is the proof that shipping is indispensable to the world development. He also assured that through this Conference, the shipping fraternity will find more avenues for the future shipping developments.

The Conference was inaugurated by Mr. Nathanael Leong, Sr. Cadet Administrator, AP Moller Maersk, Singapore. In his inaugural address, Mr Leong recalled the birth of IMO theme, Shipping Indispensable to the World. The theme has been developed to bring the coordinated development of seafarers towards meeting the global needs through shipping. He foresees that this conference would increase the visibility of shipping industry in the global arena. He accentuated that the shipping companies are not independent but are interdependent. Being a person of managing human resources for the world shipping giant AP Moller Maersk, Mr Leong has viewed that supply of trained skillful seafarers are the most important and current need of the shipping industry. Collective learning involving industry, academic and regulatory bodies would help to produce good seafarers who will be the backbone of the shipping industry.

Capt. Mahesh Saurabh, Head Sourcing and Global Cadet Programme, AP Moller Maersk, Singapore has released the Compendium of the Conference and highlighted that shipping is more important to the ever growing world economy.

Dr. Devinder Grewal, Professor of Port Management, World Maritime University, Sweden has delivered the Conference theme address wherein he insisted the roles, responsibilities and challenges for the maritime Universities to meet the challenges of shipping industry. Universities must develop knowledge, bring innovations and address the emerging challenges. He emphasized that sector specific programmes are to be introduced and strengthened. He viewed that Universities shall involve in facilitation of technology upgradation, building confidence and competence among aspiring seafarers, automation in shipping and address the regulatory issues. He urged that universities shall look in to the problems of global climate change which could affect the shipping industry for which strategies for management and development of ecofriendly technologies for shipping to be developed.

His Excellency Mr. Alem Tsehaye Woldemariam, Eritrean Ambassador of India was the Chief Guest of the Conference. In his Chief Guest Address, Ambassador, indicated the strategic position of Eritrea in the Red Sea that could affect the global shipping business positively. In addition, he provided historical notes on the maritime history of Eritrea. His note that "whoever controls the sea, controls everything in the world" holds much significance.



Dr. Nicola Crawford, Faculty Director of Nautical Studies, City of Glasgow College, Glasgow, UK has delivered the keynote address on the topic "Influence of emerging lifestyles on human resources management in shipping-a training perspective". In her presentation Dr Crawford has addressed various challenges of training maritime professional such as onboard communication issues in the multi-linguistic environment, generation barriers, technology usage, expectation of seafarers, leadership and multicultural environment. She provided a successful model of offering twinning programmes such as Higher National Diplomas where candidates from partnering institutions such as AMET will spend one year at their country and study final year at City of Glasgow College among students of many nations and multiple cultural and linguistic diversity. Overall she has concluded that the human element is the most indispensable factor for the shipping industry.

Mr. S.Karikalan, Trustee has reiterated that AMET is always keen on taking pioneering initiatives in maritime education through which it emerged as the largest producer of quality manpower on all facets of the shipping industry. He insisted that since India is the fourth most preferred nation for foreign direct investments, this conference must create more and new avenues to make the shipping industry still more glory.

A Memorandum of Understanding was signed by and between AMET University and Institute of Chartered Shipbrokers (ICS), United Kingdom to have joint academic interactions. On behalf of AMET University Vice Chancellor Col Dr G Thiruvassagam signed the MoU and Mr. Sean Walsh, Deputy Director, Institute of Chartered Ship Brokers, United Kingdom has signed on behalf of ICS. The MoU was exchanged between AMET and ICS.

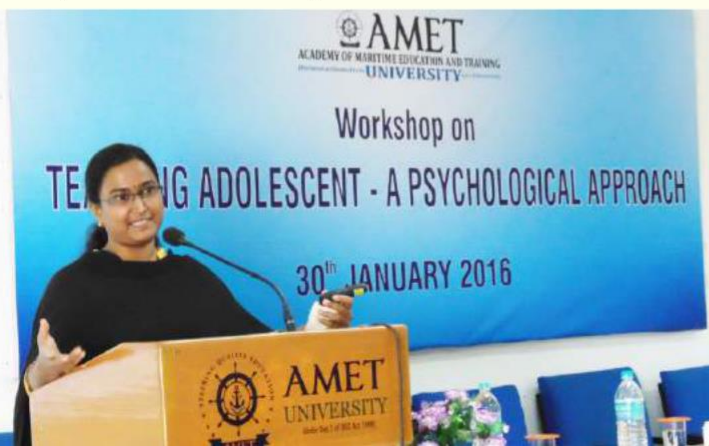

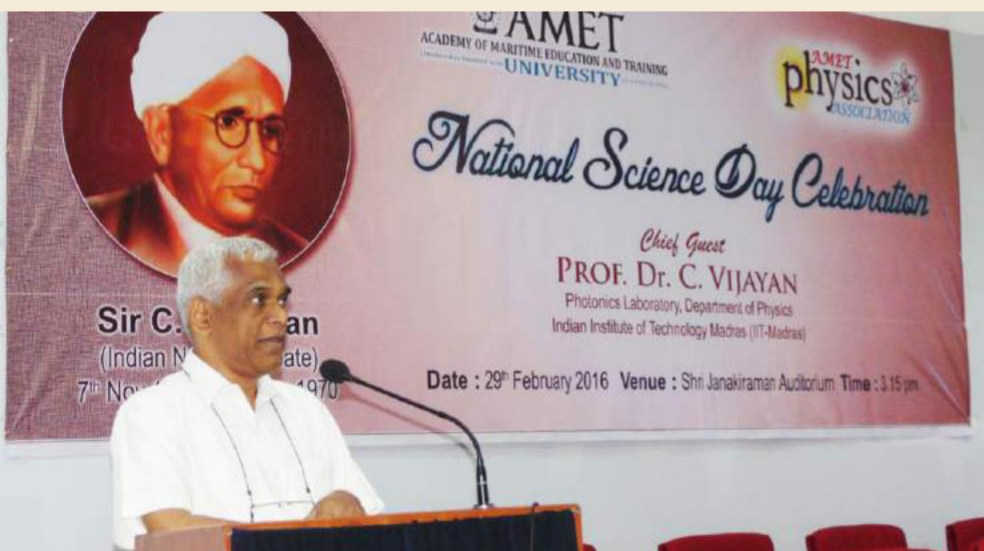
