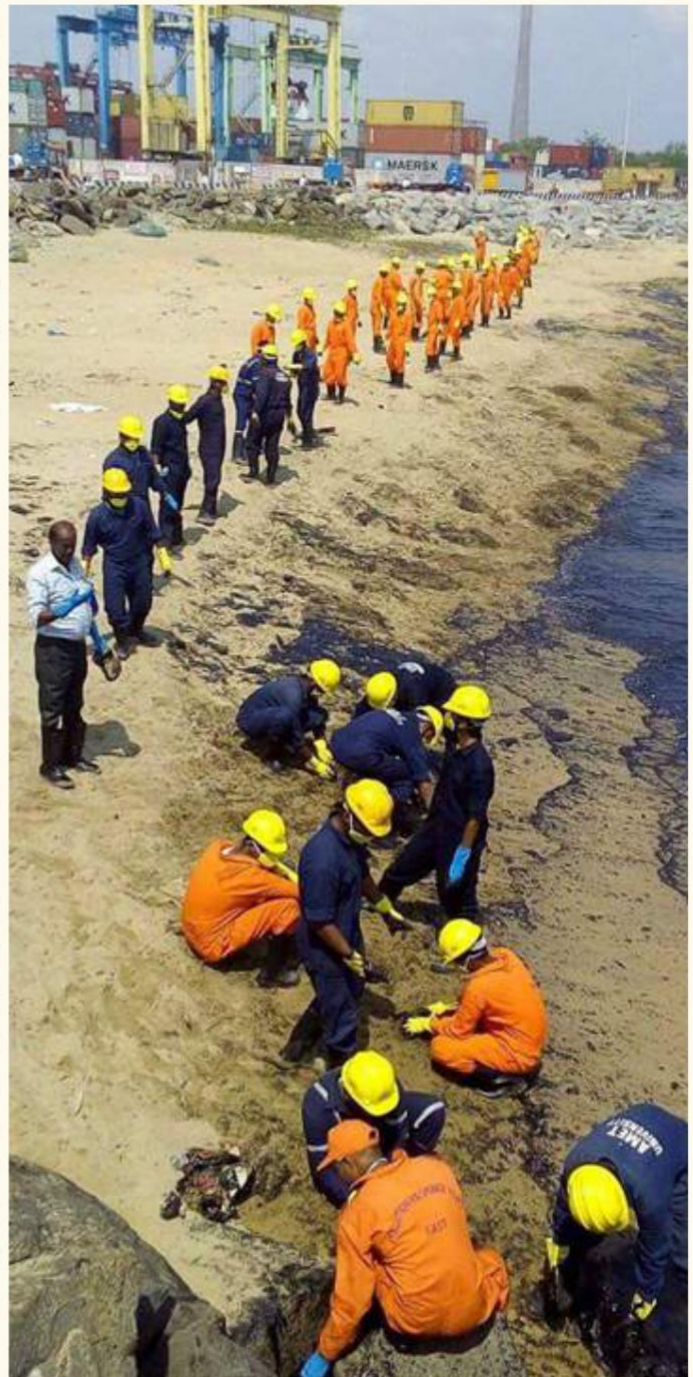
Ennore Oil Spill Cleanup Programme



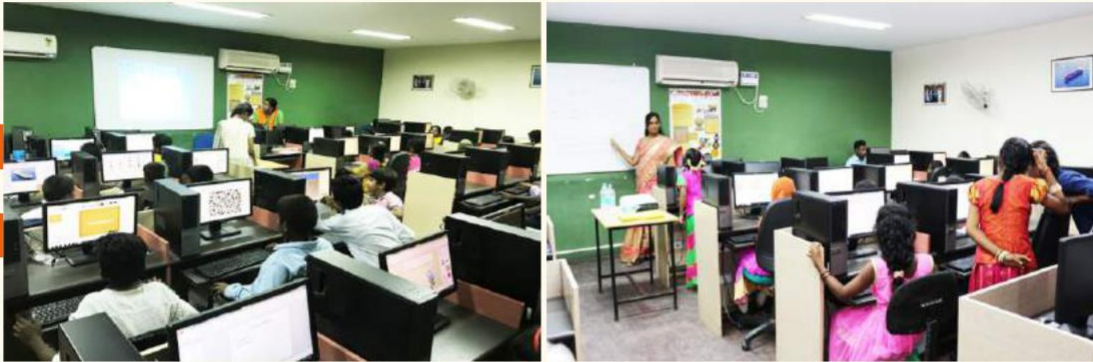
Ennore Oil Spill Cleanup Programme was conducted by the Department of Nautical Science on 8th February 2017 at Kasimedu (Bharathi Nagar Beach). Mariners have learnt IMO's regulation for collision prevention and MARPOL for pollution prevention at sea, but still collision and pollution occurs at sea, and now in inland waters of Chennai. Because of negligence of the situation, many marine organisms has led to death and many fishermen's families led to strive for food. As a future mariners, not only with community interest but with a responsibility of mariners, as the crisis has caused by our mariner family.

So on behalf of the AMET, Ennore Oil Spill Cleanup Programme was organized to clean up the oil spill in sea which caused due to collision of the ships on 28th January 2017 near Ennore Port. The Cleanup Programme on 8th February 2017 as a measure of intensification of Extension activities. With the Co-ordination of Warden. Kasinathan, 25 Cadets from B.Sc. Nautical Science, 22 Cadets from B.E. Marine Engineering had involved in the program.

The program was started by forming a human chain of volunteers in the sea shores of Kasimedu, provided with 15 drums of 200L capacity and 5 buckets and were instructed to fill them. Volunteers departed from the university at 08:30a.m and reached Kasimedu at 09:30am and the cleaning started at 10:00am and wind up at 14:30pm. The Indian Navy and Coast Guard provided us with safety gloves, safety masks, safety boots and environmental friendly cleaning materials for the safe working practices of the volunteers. The Coast Guard officers instructed what to do and they worked along with them.



Summer Camp - IT for Beginners for Rural Students

Col Dr.G.Thiruvassagam, Vice Chancellor of AMET spoke about strengthening seafarers association so that their voices are heard and their grievances redressed. He stressed upon how the new maritime labour convention is set to redress the seafarer grievances.

Mr.RajeshRamachandran, pro chancellor of AMET appreciated the cadets from other academies for taking part in the 6th edition of Navinautics 2017 and said the symposium was evolving in a grand manner every year.
